**BATTERIES * PAINT & THINNER * USED MOTOR OIL * ANTIFREEZE * ELECTRONICS
FLUORESCENT BULBS & TUBES * SYRINGES * PRESCRIPTION DRUGS**

These items are Household Hazardous Waste

Improper disposal of these wastes can pollute the environment and some types of HHW have the potential to cause physical injury to ACES Waste workers. They can contaminate septic tanks and wastewater treatment systems if poured down drains or toilets. They can also present hazards to children and pets if left around the house. Here's how to get these items safely out of your home:

FREE Household Hazardous Waste Collection Days

Batteries (car & household), paints & chemicals, pesticides, sharps/needles: Two Saturdays a month, Amador County residents can bring items to the Buena Vista Transfer station for free disposal from 9 am - 1 pm, bring Amador County ID. SEE THE SCHEDULE ON THE REVERSE OF THIS NEWSLETTER.

Household Batteries and Fluorescent Bulbs/Tubes

are also accepted at Meeks Lumber and Lone Ace Hardware.

TVs, Monitors and Other Electronics

(including cell phones, ink & toner cartridges, etc.) can be taken to the Buena Vista or Pine Grove Transfer Stations on any regular business day for free disposal.

Sharps (syringes, needles) It is illegal to throw sharps in with trash or recycling. Sharps must be in a medical sharps container and disposed on a HHW Collection Day.

Prescription Drugs may be dropped off at Jackson Police or Amador Co. Sheriff's Depts, Walgreens, or Safeway Pharmacy for safe disposal. Do not pour down the drain.

HOLIDAY SCHEDULE

Columbus Day: Normal collection, normal Office and Transfer Station hours.

Veterans Day: Normal collection and Transfer Station hours. Office closed.

Transfer Station Hours Change:

Nov. 6 through Mar. 7, Buena Vista Transfer Station hours change from 9 am - 5 pm to 8:30 am - 4:30 pm

Household Hazardous Waste Drop-Off:

Oct. 8, 22; Nov. 5, 19; Dec. 3, 17

At the Buena Vista Transfer Station, lone, 9 am - 1 pm.
Free, up to 15 gallons or 125 lbs per trip.

Fall Clean-Up, Oct. 3 -7 Within City Limits of Lone, Jackson, Sutter Creek & Plymouth:

Residential Fall Clean-up will be the week of **October 3-7**.

ACES provides customers within city limits of Lone, Jackson, Sutter Creek and Plymouth one free extra pick-up (up to one cubic yard, 3’x3’x3’, or about seven 32-gallon bags) on your normal pickup day. For general trash and yard waste, etc. -- all trash must be bagged, boxed, or bundled in a throw-away container. No single item may exceed 50 pounds or 4 feet in length.

Acceptable materials include: Paper products, general trash, non-treated wood, tools, metal, plastics, yard waste.

Unacceptable materials include: Appliances, furniture, mattresses, tires, electronic waste (TV’s, computers, etc.), motor oil, rock, dirt, concrete, paint, hot ashes, animal waste, household hazardous waste.
